Business: Development Permit Application Phase 3 Cowichan Bay Estates

Topics discussed:

- Past difficulties with water erosion and causes.
- Past overflows and damages, existing retaining pond upgrades, new retaining ponds and related drainage control structures.
- Responsibility for ongoing service of the completed drainage system.
- Soil required for deposit on each lot by owner covered by a covenant.
- Changes in drainage patterns as building takes place.
- Future sloughing in natural drainage ravines caused by increased water flows.
- Drainage system maintenance by the Regional District following the two-year period of maintenance by the Applicant.
- Geotechnical studies for slope stability having been undertaken for Sensitive Lands Steep Slope Areas not viewed by the APC but submitted to the Regional District.
- Water flows from agricultural fields increasing drainage in the Development having been considered in the drainage design.
- Notice-on-title requirement for geotechnical reports by owners of Steep Slope properties, or all properties prior to construction.

Motion: Area D APC recommends issue of a development permit for Phase 3 of Cowichan Bay Estates.

Motion carried unanimously.

Because of the complex drainage and geotechnical issues on this site, it is recommended that the Applicant:

- 1. Defines critical project milestones with Regional District staff and contacts staff when these are reached so there is the opportunity for inspection.
- 2. Works with Regional District staff to develop an ongoing schedule to monitor and maintain key drainage infrastructure during the project and after project completion.
